#### FOR THE URGENT ATTENTION OF ALL PARENTS/CARERS WHOSE CHILD TRAVELS ON CARDINAL BUS ROUTES 83 AND 84


We have been informed by Cardinal Buses (Routes 83 and 84) that from the beginning of January, those students who have bus passes issued for free by Surrey County Council will only be allowed to travel on these buses with their bus pass and valid photocard ID.

Parents are therefore requested to ensure that their child not only has their free bus pass but also has a valid Surrey photocard ID.

The College has a limited supply of these photocards. If your son/daughter requires a photocard please send them to Kingston reception with a passport sized photograph and we will complete the photocard for them.

Failure to provide both the bus pass and valid photocard may result in either the student being charged to travel, or they may be refused entry onto the 83 or 84.

#### YEAR 7 STUDENTS ATTEND INTERNET SAFETY SEMINAR

If your Year 7 son/daughter came home on Wednesday asking for an alarm clock for Christmas, it's because Mr Cleary delivered his fantastic Year 7 seminar on internet safety.

As part of our PSHE curriculum, students learnt about the dangers of technology and how they can use this safely. Whilst students are in Year 7 we have a zero tolerance policy to mobile phones. We do appreciate and understand students may need a mobile phone and, with



so much information available to them in the palm of their hands, it is important that we educate our young people on how to use these devices safely. Students were surprised to learn that YouTube's minimum age is 18 and were even more shocked when Mr Cleary pointed out the bill payer is ultimately the owner and the one responsible for their mobile phone.

Alongside this session, students were also sent a survey to find out what they already knew about social media and technology, and the results were pretty surprising. Alongside our student seminar, we will also be hosting a parent/carer information seminar in the new year, with details to be sent out shortly. The aim of this event is to educate those at home about the ever-changing and evolving face of technology and social media.

Thank you to Mr Cleary for delivering this session and thank you to our students for being incredibly attentive throughout.

#### **BEBRAS COMPUTING CHALLENGE 2023**

#### **During November all students in Years 7, 8 and 9, and those studying GCSE Computing and Cambridge National IT, took part in the Bebras challenge.**

The Bebras Computing Challenge introduces computational thinking to students. Last November over 365,000 students took part in the UK, and over 3 million worldwide. Each participant answers questions that focus on computational and logical thinking.

This year we had over 67 students receive a gold award, meaning they scored in the top 10% of their age group.

A special mention to **Alfie Diggins-Barnes** in Year 10 who scored the maximum score of 200 in the Senior age group. Only five students in the whole of the UK managed to achieve this score.



When you log into Edulink you will be able to see a new icon shaped like a bell (Absence Reporting) as per the image to the right.

When you click on this you will be taken to a page where absences are reported (Image 2). Your child's name and photo will appear where the blue box sits in the image below.

- For illness we ask that you only report one day at a time on the day of absence.
- However, you will be able to report an absence for medical appointments, etc. in advance.



- Holiday requests should still be requested via our Leave of Absence form that can be collected from any reception and is also available on Edulink (Noticeboard, Forms).
- Select date From\* and To\*
- Insert Reason for Absence\*. Please do not state unwell or illness. Please specify details of the issue as you would have done via our previous recorded telephone calls (example in Image 2).


