YEAR 11 STUDENT REPORTS ON HER WHEELER PROGRAMME EXPERIENCE



WELLINGTON COLLEGE



Established in 2017 by Wellington College, the Wheeler Programme is a fully funded educational programme for one hundred selected state school pupils. Twenty students are selected in Year 9 and the College helps support them until their graduation from the programme at the end of Year 13, by which time they will have found their confidence and identified their future academic and professional goals.

Nischal Gurung (11A) is a Collingwood student who has been selected to be part of the Wheeler Programme and writes here about one of her Programme experiences:

In June, I spent a week on a residential at Wellington College where I got to participate in various activities which were very different but exciting. They ranged from taking part in Chemistry lessons to being on the radio.

On one of the days I took part in a shooting session which was an amazing experience although my aim wasn't as accurate as I thought. The teachers showed us how to be safe while holding a rifle and let us shoot first hand after viewing their demonstration. It was thrilling!

On another day we went out of college and visited Reading University which was eye opening to see the options we can take to pave our future.

My favourite thing I did during my time there was when we visited Sky Studios. It was really fascinating getting to see behind the scenes of what we view on the TV.

After being put into groups, I got to make my own news report and film it, capturing how it feels to be a reporter. My group wrote the scripts on the topic we were given (impact of extreme weather) and directed and filmed it. We even dressed up and acted in it. I think it was the best and I really enjoyed the week as a whole.





It is an amazing opportunity for me to discuss my future path, meet new people and try out new things.

I also loved picking out songs and discussing random topics on the radio where I branched out and spoke while also controlling the radio system.

PARENTAL INFORMATION

Catering Arrangements

The College's caterers are Innovate Catering (part of the Impact Food Group), who provide a cashless system for school meals. Students are issued with an ID card that contains an intelligent chip which communicates to the till systems when used. A variety of different options are provided across the College's five catering outlets each day. Menus are updated regularly and are available for parents and carers to view in Edulink.

Parents must ensure that their child's ID card is credited and available for use at the commencement of the new academic year. Please see Parent Pay below for further information. It is obviously up to parents to decide how much money to put on their child's card at any one time, although an amount of between £2.70 and £3.50 per day is average. Parents may set a daily spend limit by contacting the Catering Team on ext 405.

Students who qualify for Free School Meals will have their entitlement loaded on to their ID cards daily.

First Aid Provision

If feeling unwell in a lesson all students must have a 'written permission' note from the teacher allowing them to leave the classroom and walk to the nearest Year Manager's office for paracetamol or plasters or to the nearest reception for all other first aid requirements. If a student receives paracetamol, they will be provided with a slip showing the time given and when they left first aid.

If the teacher feels the student needs an escort, another student will escort. The escort will be sent back to class once the unwell child reaches a first aider. Students feeling dizzy or faint must always be accompanied.

Students who do not have written permission by the relevant teacher will be sent back to the classroom to get this done. This is to ensure they have been to lessons and are accounted for by their teacher. Students do not require written permission to attend first aid at break time, lunchtime or during PE.

Students should not contact parents themselves requesting that they collect them from College if they feel unwell. They must report to their Year Manager or reception. <u>Medication in College</u>

If your child carries an asthma inhaler or auto injector, we recommend that we hold a spare in reception. You will need to provide the medication in its original prescribed packaging and complete a form provided at Barossa or Kingston reception (**Parental agreement for Collingwood to administer medicine**).

The same will apply for other medication prescribed by a GP or hospital doctor.

ATTENDANCE - LEAVE OF ABSENCE/ HOLIDAY REQUESTS

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.
