The Practice group, Lexie Coster, James Dimmock, Jacob Porter and Ryan De Ruijter all battled to make a competent team having not really met before January this year. They demonstrated excellent skills in navigating, leadership, cooking and team work to successfully complete their Practice ready for their Qualifying/Assessed expedition next year. They now have a year to prepare for five days of expedition next April, alongside completing their other four sections of Volunteering, Physical efforts to keep fit, learning new Skills and completing their Residential section where they have to volunteer or learn a new skill for at least a week away from home and not knowing anyone else.

The Assessed group of Emily Green, Leona Miles, Connie Currie-Rogers and Harrison Taylor successfully completed their Qualifying Expedition and spent five days and four nights in the wilds of the Brecon National Park. Some of their camping included almost wild camping with only a tap of running water and nothing else. They had to survive with the equipment and food they had packed in their rucksacks and navigate a difficult course to climb Pen-y-Fan one of the highest ranges in the area. This group are a rare group



who have done their Bronze, Silver and Gold together at Collingwood and although now depleted in numbers they have stuck together as a group of friends and learned to support each other in ways to overcome some of the many challenges they faced.



Alex their Assessor was nicknamed the 'Assassin' as he never smiled and just met up with them at various points, whilst still always tracking them. His knowledge of the area is immense, and they had to keep on their route or fear him giving them harder challenges to do each day. They rose to the occasion and successfully completed their expedition without any major incidents, which is an achievement in itself. They completed their written project on the Ecology of the Brecon Mountains to an audience of parents, SLT and Assessors alongside the Silver DofE participants.

They can truly say that this was the hardest experience of their lives so far, but they are interested to keep together as a group and maybe set themselves more challenges in the future. Now they just have to complete some of their remaining sections and then they will be off to Buckingham Palace next year, fingers crossed.


# MORE ABLE STUDENTS SHOW GREAT COOKING SKILLS

### STUDENTS TAKE ON MATHS CHALLENGES

#### **UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge**

In January approximately 250 students took the UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge, mostly in Kingston Theatre but some in their Maths lessons.

Following this Challenge, four students were invited to take part in the Maclaurin Mathematical Olympiad and the Pink Kangaroo competitions.

#### **Maclaurin Mathematical Olympiad**

As a follow-on round to the Intermediate Maths Challenge, the Maclaurin Maths Olympiad is a two hour challenge consisting of six Olympiad style Maths problems. Entry to the Intermediate Olympiads is by invitation based on a qualifying IMC score.



We are so pleased to celebrate in the success of Daniel Watts (Year 11) who was the only student invited to take part and achieved a merit in this highly prestigious competition.

#### Pink Kangaroo 2025

The Pink Kangaroo is also a follow-on round to the Intermediate Maths Challenge. It is a 60 minute, 25 multiple choice challenge. Entry to the Pink Kangaroo is also by invitation based on a qualifying IMC score.

Congratulations to the three students who were invited to take part. The top scoring 10% of participants will receive a Gold Kangaroo Certificate (Alfie Diggins-Barnes), the next 20% a Silver Kangaroo Certificate and the next 30% a Bronze Kangaroo Certificate (Arthur Voinescu).

#### **UKMT Junior Maths Challenge**

The Junior Maths Challenge is open to students in Years 7 and 8, and is a 60 minute, 25 multiple choice Challenge. It encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency. The problems on the Junior Maths Challenge are designed to make students think, most are accessible yet still challenge those with more experience. 40 students took this challenge after College on Thursday 1 May and we would like to congratulate the following students who succeeded in achieving gold, silver and bronze certificates. Well done to all those who firstly agreed to attending after College to complete the challenge (there were no Maths lessons during the day for these year groups) and secondly for their success. For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.


Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results, but it is very costly.



I very much appreciate your understanding and co-operation in adhering to these procedures and thank you for your support in maintaining positive College-parent/carer relationships.






