Dear Parent/Carer

First and foremost, I would like to take the opportunity to thank you for your support over the first term in what continues to be challenging times for everyone.

You may have noticed a different name attached to much of our communication about attendance since the start of the term. Our previous Attendance Manager, Maureen Crowther, sadly retired at the end of last term and we were able to reshape the role to become a more outward-facing position and one that was less data analytical. In doing so we were excited to appoint our new Attendance Manager, Rebecca West, who comes to us from Kings International, someone who was integral in increasing their attendance rates. What she has brought is a depth of knowledge regarding attendance and more clarity in expectations of us as a College and of our families.

She has already had an impact, liaising directly with families and individuals within specific year groups. In reshaping the processes and platforms we used, she has already created time to be working with families and students to see how we can improve their attendance and/or punctuality.

As a result of some of these changes, we would like to take the opportunity to remind you of our expectations regarding attendance as per our policy:

- ◆ It is imperative that you report your child's absence first thing in the morning and on every day of absence. This will prevent you receiving a Truancy Call which is, as you will have seen if you have received one of these in the past couple of weeks, being sent earlier in the day.
- ◆ If you receive an Absence/Truancy Call please respond immediately.
- ◆ If you have any communication regarding your child's absence, please notify Mrs West using the absence line. Please do not report absence through Year Managers or Form Tutors, although copying them in is more than appropriate so that they are kept in the loop regarding your child's absence.
- ◆ Mrs West will also be sending out written communications when attendance and punctuality falls below our expectations.

Please can I also draw your attention to the Edulink communication that was sent out last week which asked for your co-operation in notifying us if your child returns 'early' from their period of isolation which according to the authority should be 10 days but with two negative lateral flow tests means they can return after 5 days.

If you do receive an Absence/Truancy Call, please do not be angry with the College. I am sure you will appreciate we want to ensure our safeguarding procedures are followed, in ensuring the welfare of your child. Similarly, if you receive a communication or request for information that you know we know about or know the answer to please bear with us. Mrs West is working tirelessly to get up to speed with the knowledge of our key individuals with our Pastoral Team, but one or two communications may slip through the net. Reporting absence through the absence line is the best way to ensure Mrs West knows the reason for absence.

If you need support with your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to contact us. Of course, your child's Form Tutor, Year Manager and Pastoral Assistant still play a crucial role in their attendance and all other matters. However, for reporting absence, requesting leave of absence (which will only be granted in exceptional circumstances) and/or requesting support of the Inclusion Service (previously Education Welfare) our new Attendance Manager will be the member of staff you need to liaise with directly.

We will continue to do what we can to promote attendance including incentives. We are always keen to impress to students it is the first thing future Colleges, Universities and Employers ask about in their reference requests.

Build the habit of good attendance to ensure success at College.

Help your child to succeed in College by:

- ◆ Encouraging them to attend College unless they are feeling really unwell. Students can fall behind if they miss just one or two days of College every few weeks.
- ◆ Chat to them about the importance of being on time to lessons as arriving late can disrupt the learning for themselves and others.
- ◆ Reminding them that missing even 5% of their lessons leaves them with a significant amount of work to do at a later date.

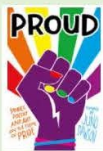

BOOK OF THE WEEK (suitable for all years)



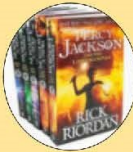

READING CLUB

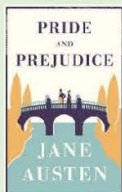
