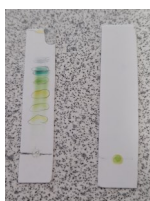

STUDENTS DEMONSTRATE GREAT SCIENTIFIC SKILLS

13 students from Years 7-9 attended the 'More Able Provision for Science' session on Wednesday 30 April.

The students experienced being a Scientist at first hand and had the opportunity to carry out a complicated practical which is normally part of A Level Biology curriculum.



The students demonstrated outstanding practical skills and managed to achieve accurate results for their practical. The practical was for the students to separate as many pigments as they could in a spinach leaf using Thin Layer Chromatography (TLC).

4 students out of 13 managed to separate all seven pigments in the spinach leaves using TLC which required the students to follow the method very precisely and have an eye for detail.

Well done to Dylan Sandhu (Year 7), Morgan Irving (Year 7), Michael Coltman (Year 9) and Mikey Turner (Year 8) for their practical skills.

EXAM CERTIFICATES

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the Summer 2025 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results, but it is very costly.






"One of the biggest challenges I face during my workday is staying focused during long meetings. My ADHD means my attention span isn't always great, and not being able to focus can be frustrating. I've been open and honest with my team, and when I need a break, I take one.

To stay organised and focused, which can be hard at times, I use a combination of digital tools and physical planners.

I break down large tasks into smaller, manageable steps to avoid feeling overwhelmed. If I do get overwhelmed, I'm transparent with my manager and take a break to let my brain breathe.

My company has given me a few adjustments to support me, such as standing desks and noise cancelling headphones. They've also made me aware of tools like speech-to-text, which helps with my writing and is actually what I'm using to write this article!"
